HEAD COACH PAT MINEO

Fourth-year head coach Pat Mineo brings more than 20 years of coaching experience to the Utica College softball program.

In 2006, Mineo was named the Empire 8 Conference Coach of the Year after leading the team to a program-best record of 31-11 overall. The season included an appearance in the Empire 8 Tournament, the first time in program history, where UC made it to the championship game. The team earned the No. 2 seed in the ECAC Tournament and made an appearance in that championship game as well.

Mineo has accumulated 20 years of service as a volunteer travel coach with the CNY Shockers and coached at New York Mills and Whitesboro High School. Mineo's teams have competed



in the ASA and PONY National Tournaments, as well as several NYS Softball Tournaments. The veteran softball coach won the 23-under New York State Tournament and has appeared in several High School Sectional competitions.

Mineo, a resident of New Hartford, NY has also spent 20 years as a New Hartford Girls Softball (NHGS) board member, and currently serves as commissioner for the New York State ASA Junior Olympic committee.

The 2008 Utica College women's softball team hopes to return to the glory of the 2006 season, where the Pioneers tallied a school-record 31 victories and a visit to the Empire 8 and ECAC tournaments. Head Coach Pat Mineo was named conference coach of the year, and the Pioneers earned the No. 2 seed in the ECAC Upstate Championships.

After a disappointing 2007 campaign where UC finished with a 15-17 record, a solid group of maturing talent is inspired to wreak havoc on the Empire 8 Conference once again.

"We certainly lost some games last season that we felt we could have won, and that is disappointing," says fourth year Head Coach Pat Mineo. "I think those type of loses will be fuel for our girls this season and I will do my best to ensure that they come to play on a consistent basis, day in and day out."

UC returns thirteen players and nine starters from last season. The Pioneers watched seven sophomores help lead the team to five key conference victories. Now, with experience and not youth leading the way, the Pioneers' look to improve on that mark.

In 2007 UC hit .330 as a team, while holding their opponents to a .282 average. UC also earned its second straight trip to the Empire 8 Conference Tournament but lost in two straight games to national-powerhouse Ithaca College and conference rival RIT.

Four of the Pioneers' key returning players earned Empire 8 All-Conference Team accolades last season. Senior third baseman **Brittany Johnson** earned first team honors and batted .323 with 18 RBI, six doubles, a triple, and a homerun. Junior utility player **Andrea Curley** also earned all-conference honors, making the first-team for the second straight year. Curley led the team with a 3.51 earned run average and tallied an 8-8 record on the mound for the Pioneers. She also hit .345, including 30 hits, 21 RBI and two homeruns.

Junior outfielder **Abby Drew** is also one of

the most feared hitters in the conference. Drew batted .380 with 35 hits and started in all 30 games for the Pioneers. She led the team with 37 RBI, ten home-runs, and garnered a second straight spot on the



all-conference second team. Senior **Ashley Kaufman** earned all-conference honorable mention with an outstanding first year for UC. Kaufman played in all 30 games last season and led the team with a .408 average, 42 hits, 11 doubles and eight stolen bases. She also collected 25 RBI and 23 runs scored.

"We have two strong pitchers in Mathis and Curley, two juniors who now have two full seasons of collegiate work under their belts," said Mineo. "We are strong defensively up the middle, with Butler and Kupiec. If we can gets the bats going at the right time this year I think the girls will be very happy with the outcome."

Junior pitcher **Kallie Mathis** finished the 2007 season with a 3.95 ERA and 7-7 record. She also led the team with 75 strikeouts and earned all-conference sportswoman of the year honors. Junior shortstop **Kourtney Kupiec** batted .388 and played in all 30 games for the Pioneers. She also collected 33 hits, 23 runs, nine RBI, and four stolen bases.

After an outstanding 2006 campaign, senior second baseman **Amanda Butler** looks to bounce back from an off-season in 2007. Butler played in all 30 games last year batting .297 with 30 hits, 16 runs scored, and 12 RBI. She also finished with a .963 fielding percentage. Butler has shown that she has potential to lead the Pioneers back to the Empire 8 Conference Tournament with an outstanding bat and glove. In 2006, she batted a teamhigh .418. She also collected 46 hits, 28 RBI, seven doubles, and two homeruns.

Junior first baseman **Rinae Olsen** hopes to have a break out season after showing signs of greatness in two previous seasons.
