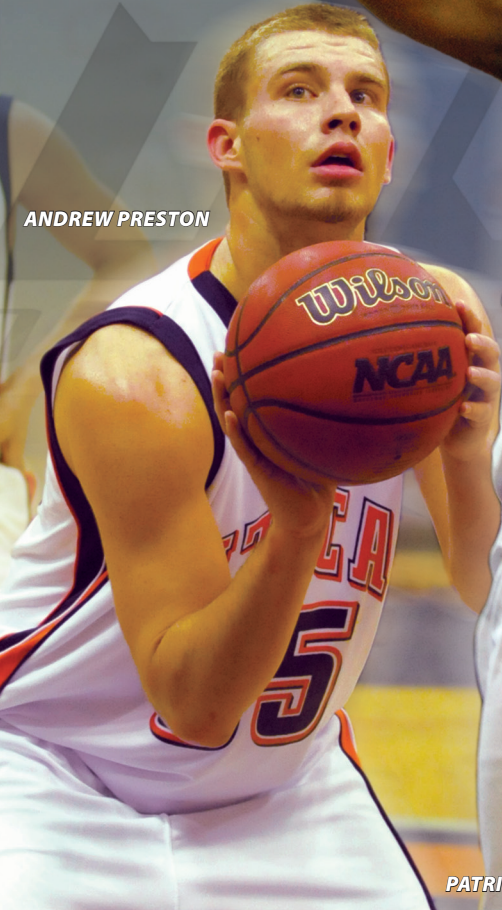

The Empire 8 has been serving its membership in various forms over the past 40 years.

In 1964, Alfred University, Clarkson University, Hobart College, Rensselaer, St. Lawrence University, and Union College joined together to form the Independent College Athletic Conference (ICAC). Its primary purpose was aimed at schedule making for a few major sports. Union soon dropped out to be replaced later by Ithaca College and RIT. The conference remained at seven institutions for 20 years. Hobart and William Smith merged as one member and

Hartwick College entered the conference in 1991.

In 1991, the ICAC reorganized and the Empire Athletic Association (EAA) emerged as a quality conference composed of institutions with top academic and athletic reputations.

Since 1993, the EAA served as a single sport conference for Men and Women's Basketball. Soon after the departure of Hobart/William Smith, RPI, and St. Lawrence, Elmira College, Nazareth College, and Utica College joined the EAA to maintain six members and a cohesive basketball alignment. In 1998, Alfred University and St. John Fisher became the latest of the eight official members.

In the Fall of 1999, the EAA officially became the Empire 8 which evolved into a comprehensive conference for 13 sports for men and women. The conference also employed its first full-time Commissioner. In August 2001, the conference hired its second and current Commissioner, Chuck Mitrano. In July of 2002, the conference hired its first part-time SID, Timothy Farrell. On August 7, 2002 the Presidents Council officially became part of the governance structure and a new revised Constitution was adopted. In March 2006, the Empire 8 announced that Stevens Institute of Technology would become a full member of the conference in Fall 2007.

The members of the Empire 8 are committed first and foremost to the pursuit of academic excellence and aspire to be regarded as an outstanding NCAA Division III conference. The membership seeks to distinguish itself among its peer group for its quality institutions, spirited and sportsmanlike competition, outstanding services and highly ethical policies and practices. Its commitment to serve the educational needs of its student-athletes is the hallmark of the Empire 8.

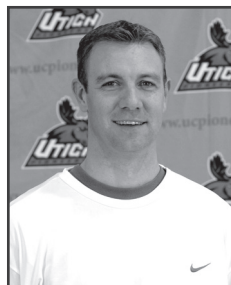

Connolly, who is the fifth coach in program-history, enters his second season as head coach of the Utica College men's basketball team. In his first season with the Pioneers general he guided UC to a 17-9 overall record and an appearance in the 2008-09 Empire 8 Conference Tournament.

Prior to Utica he spent four seasons as head men's basketball coach and administrative assistant at Empire 8 Conference member Elmira College in Elmira, NY.

His coaching resume prior to Elmira College includes a two year stint as assistant coach at Division II LeMoyne College where he guided the Dolphins to consecutive 17-win seasons. Following a successful playing career at Hartwick College, Connolly joined the Hawks coaching staff in 1997 as an assistant coach for five seasons where he was involved in all aspects of the men's basketball

program. In his first year as an assistant coach at Hartwick he also acted as an assistant director of admissions, where he coordinated all aspects of recruiting students from the New England area. He also spent three seasons as head coach of the Central Region men's basketball team at the Empire State games and he guided his team to an Open Division Silver Medal in 2002.

Connolly graduated from Hartwick College in 1996 with a degree in biology. As a student he served as team captain of the men's basketball team in his senior campaign, capping a four-year career highlighted by a trip to the NCAA Tournament.

Connolly spent four years rebuilding the Elmira College men's basketball program and he guided the Soaring Eagles to a 6-19 overall record and an eighth place finish in the conference in 2007-08. He coached two Empire 8 All-Conference honorees during his tenure at Elmira and in 2007-08 two of his freshmen garnered a combined seven conference rookie of the week awards.

As an administrative assistant at Elmira, Connolly was responsible for assisting Vice President of Athletics Patricia Thompson with scheduling the Soaring Eagles athletic contests.

Connolly, a 1992 graduate of Richfield Springs High School, currently resides in New Hartford, NY with his wife Jennifer, his daughter, Rhyann and son, James.

Brian Collier enters his third season as the graduate assistant coach of the men's basketball team. Collier played four years (2003-2007) under head coach Andy Goodemote and graduated from Utica College in May of '07 with a degree in history and a minor in education. He carried a 3.64 grade point average as a student-athlete at UC.

Collier will be responsible for assisting Connolly with player personnel, recruiting, scouting and assisting with day-to-day operation in the office.

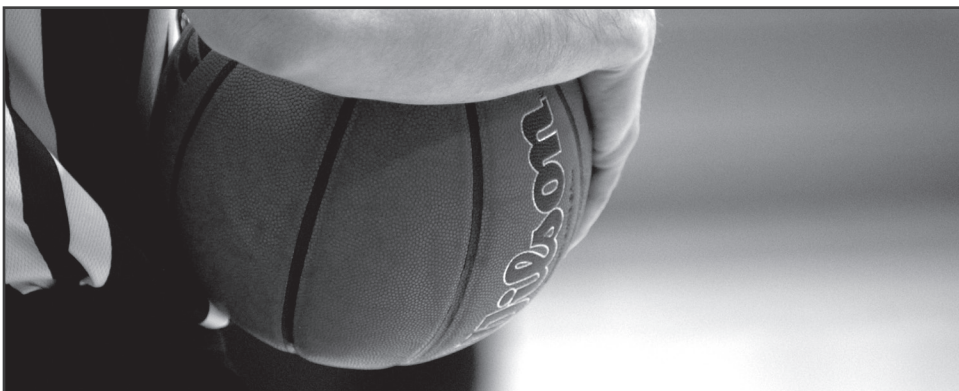
His previous coaching experience includes four years of coaching AAU boys and girls basketball.

Collier, who played both point and shooting guard, was named team captain in 2006-07 after guiding the Pioneers' to a 23-7 overall record and an appearance in the 'Sweet 16' of the NCAA Division III Tournament in 2005-06. He graduated as the schools all-time leader in assists and career games played.

Collier was UC's representative as the 2007 Kiwanis Male Student Athlete Award. The award is given to the most outstanding male and female student-athletes based on performance in the classroom, community involvement and athletic accomplishments.

He is a 2003 graduate of Norwich High School where played both football and basketball. He was a three-time all-conference football player and an all-state point guard for the Purple Tornados.

Originally from Norwich, NY, Brian currently resides in Utica.



The Utica Pioneers begin the 2009 with many changes, but remain confident heading into the new season. Despite seven opening-game players from last year not returning, second year head Coach **Christopher Connolly** will look to make it back-to-back seasons in the conference tournament, and continue to improve on last year.

"Our goal is the same as it is every year, make the league playoffs," said coach Connolly. "It's easy to look ahead to other things, but the league playoffs is our first goal."

The Pioneers completed a successful yet disappointing season in 2009. In his first season here, Connolly led the team to a 17-9 record, including an 11-5 record in the Empire 8, good for third in the conference. However, the season was bittersweet after losing to RIT in the conference playoffs. The squad was a senior-heavy team. Doug Herring was named a first team all conference player, leading the team in points (15.6) and assists (5), while fellow seniors James McClendon, Justin Maxwell, and Justin Smith contributed 7.4, 6.2, and 5.3 points, respectively. As a whole, 103 minutes per game will have to be made up for this year, but for the Pioneers, that just means more opportunities.

"Last year was a very successful year, but we lost a lot of talent," said Assistant Coach **Brian Collier**. "We are going to need our new players to step up and fill the void."

Utica will be led by seniors **Patrick Goodman** (Whitesboro, NY) and **Andrew Preston** (Port Washington, NY). Both seniors will look to make it four winning seasons for their careers. Goodman enjoyed a stellar junior season at power forward, as he was named an honorable mention all-conference player. He played 24 minutes a game, averaged 12.3 points and 4.8 rebounds per

game, while shooting 50 percent from the field. Goodman will look to finish his Pioneer career strong, as his inside-outside ability on the floor will again cause problems for opponents.

"Pat came in this year in great shape, and has that senior confidence about him," said Connolly. "I expect him to keep playing like he did last year."

Preston played in all 26 contests last year for the Pioneers, averaging 7.5 minutes per game off the bench, while shooting 51 percent from the floor. Preston's value to the team cannot be measured in statistics, as he has been a consistent off-the-court leader and role model since day one.

"His flexibility is important to us," said Connolly. "It's very easy to put him in different spots, and we need him to continue to bring his versatility."

The Pioneers have several juniors expecting to play key minutes. Guard **James Patterson** (Poughkeepsie, NY) will be the leader of the group, and will handle the point guard duties again this season. Patterson played 30 minutes per game last season, averaging 11.5 points per game. **Will Abrams** (Somerset, NJ) will look to contribute more this season, after averaging 14 minutes and 3.9 points per game last year. **Robert Whyte** (Pompton Plains, NJ) was slowed by a back injury last year, and was only able to play in nine contests, but did manage 5.4 points per game.

Other juniors expected to contribute this year are **Tracey Lewis** (New York, NY), **George Schultz** (Ridgefield, NJ), and **Marlon Davidson** (Jamaica, NY), all entering their second season on the team.

"This year the junior class has the opportunity to play significant minutes," said Collier. "They will have to contribute in order for us to be successful again."

Junior transfer **Geoff Brown** (Utica, NY) and freshmen **Kevin Johnson** (Queens, NY) and **Jeff Ward** (Ossining, NY) will look to make an impact for the Pioneers.

The non-conference schedule will be a challenge. The combined record in 2008 of the eight teams they will play was 122-92. Utica will, as always, play their local non-conference rivals, Hamilton College and SUNY IT. Hamilton finished last season with an 18-11 record, and has defeated the Pioneers each of the last three seasons. SUNY IT finished last season with a 23-7 record while winning their conference, and they also won a first round game in the NCAA tournament.

"We always play a tough non-conference schedule," said Connolly. "No matter what their record is, teams like Union, Cortland, and SUNY IT are tough teams, and it gets us ready for our Empire 8 league games."

The Empire 8 conference will again be a tough go around for the Pioneers. Five league opponents played post-season basketball last season. Ithaca, RIT, Nazareth, and Utica made the conference tournament. RIT (19-9) won the conference tournament and joined at-large bid Ithaca (24-3) in the NCAA tournament. St. John Fisher (17-10) lost to Hartwick (15-12) in the ECAC Northeast Championship. Although all conference players Mark Carson (RIT) and Sean Burton (Ithaca) have graduated, the league returns many good young players. Nazareth's all-conference senior Corey McAdam will be the favorite for league player of the year.

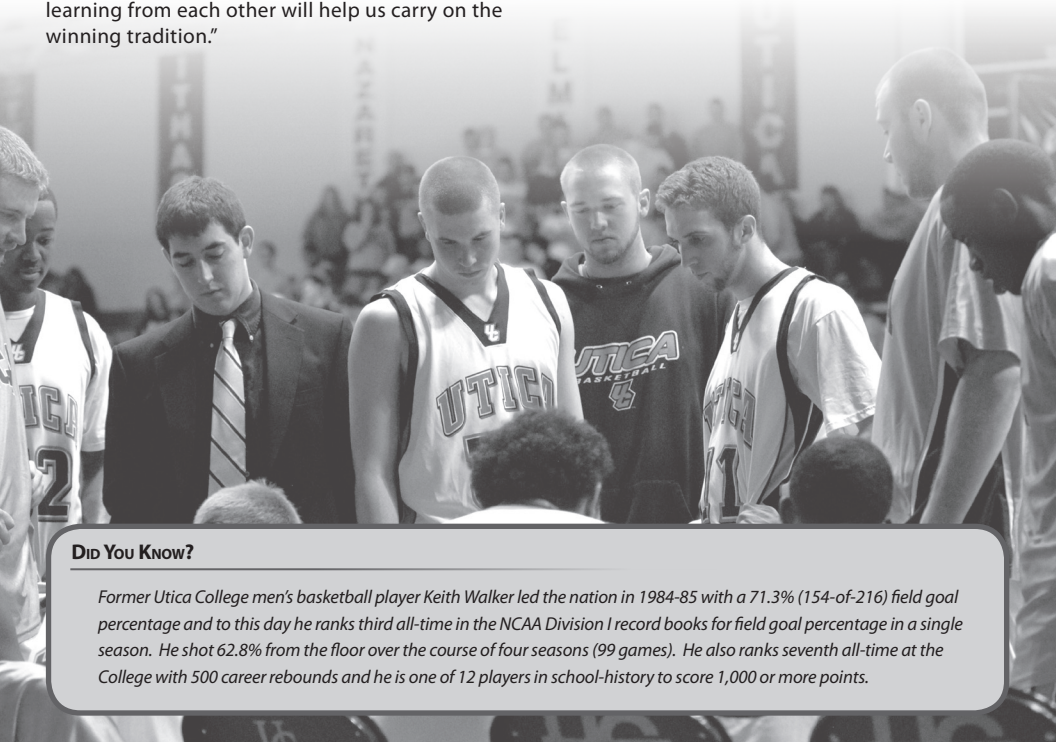
The Pioneers have enjoyed a smooth transition from long time head Coach Andrew Goodemote, to second year leader Chris Connolly. The winning didn't stop, as Utica has had four winning seasons in a row, including one NCAA tournament appearance. The program looks to continue its winning reputation that it has built up over the last half-decade, and hopes to achieve more postseason accolades moving forward.

"We expect to keep competing, bring in quality athletes that want to play hard, and we expect our upperclassmen to teach our younger players, because success breeds success," said Connolly. "The believing, the right attitude, and the learning from each other will help us carry on the winning tradition."



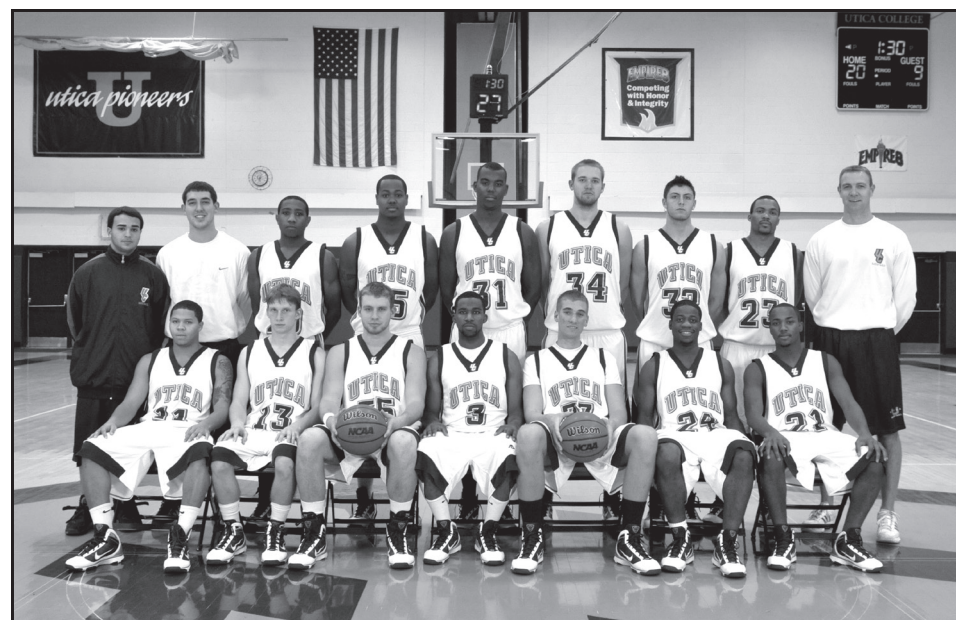

Did You Know?

Former Utica College men's basketball player Keith Walker led the nation in 1984-85 with a 71.3% (154-of-216) field goal percentage and to this day he ranks third all-time in the NCAA Division I record books for field goal percentage in a single season. He shot 62.8% from the floor over the course of four seasons (99 games). He also ranks seventh all-time at the College with 500 career rebounds and he is one of 12 players in school-history to score 1,000 or more points.

Scored in double digits 18 times, with three games scoring over 20, and added 13 games of five rebounds or more ... Had 17 games of five field goals or more ... Led the team in points six times and rebounds six times ... Scored a career-high 25

points on 9-of-11 shooting against conference rival Alfred (2/21/09) ... Added games of 24 and 21 points against conference rival Nazareth (2/13/09) and Lehman College (11/21/08) ... Recorded a career-high 12 rebounds against St. John Fisher (2/20/09).

Scored a career-high 19 points, on 4-for-5 shooting from behind the arc, in a victory over conference rival St. John Fisher (2/2/08) ... He also grabbed 11 rebounds in the win over Fisher ... Scored ten points and grabbed a career-high 13 rebounds in the Pioneers' 74-67 win over Potsdam (2/5/07) ... Started the final 12 games of the season ... Averaged 21.8 minutes per game ... Led the team in rebounding four times and scoring once ... Scored at least four points in 21-of-24 games ... Totaled 108 rebounds on the year and snagged at least one rebound in 24-of-25 contests.

2006-07: Played in 25 games while starting eight as a freshman ... Averaged 4.6 points and 3.2 rebounds per game ... Shot a team-best 40 percent from three-point range ... On Nov. 17th in the Pioneers' season opener, Goodman collected a team-high seven rebounds while scoring a season-high 13 points in the Pioneers' 104-37 victory over Paul Smiths College ... Averaged 12.7 minutes per game ... Knocked down 44 field goals ... Scored at least two points in 21 of 25 games ... Totaled 11 assists, nine blocks and seven steals ... PIONEER'S ADVANCE TO SWEET 16 OF NCAA DIVISION III TOURNAMENT

WORCESTER, MA – Junior forward **Ray Bryant** (Utica, NY) scored a game-high 29 points and grabbed 14 rebounds as the Utica College men's basketball team defeated nationally-ranked Worcester Polytechnic Institute 76-58 Friday night in the second-round of the NCAA Division III men's basketball tournament.

The Engineers jumped out to a 10-0 lead and held Utica scoreless for the first 4:09, until Bryant, who was recently named to the Empire 8 All Conference First-Team, got the Pioneers on the board with two free-throws. Utica then went on a 9-0 run behind a **Doug Herring** (Poughkeepsie, NY) 3-pointer and a Bryant lay-up.

Utica took their first lead of the game on a free-throw by senior captain **Justin Cichon** (New Hartford, NY) with 8:39 remaining in the first-half. The Pioneers led by as many as six points, but WPI would not back down and junior guard Ryan Cain (Webster, MA) knocked down a 3-pointer as time expired in the first half. Utica went into the locker room at halftime with a 32-29 lead.

Cichon converted a 3-point play 3:14 into the second half to give Utica their first double-digit lead of the game. Ryan Flynn (Hamilton, MA) hit two free-throws for the Engineers to cut the lead to six points, but that was the closest WPI would get as Utica took a 15 point lead after a **Brian Collier** (Norwich, NY) 3-pointer from the top of the arc.

Utica had three players score in double-digits, including 17 points for Herring on 3-of-6 shooting from 3-point land. Cichon tallied 16 points and grabbed five rebounds, while co-captain **Willie Lucas** (Brooklyn, NY)

scored nine points and grabbed seven rebounds for the Pioneers.

Cain tallied a team-high 21 points and eight other Engineers put points on the board. Antoine Coleman (Everett, MA), who found himself in foul trouble early on in the first half, scored nine points, while Brian Steele (Whitinsville, MA), who is the reigning WPI Male Athlete of the Week, tallied eight.

WPI, who reached the sectionals of the NCAA tournament last season, tied a school record for wins in a season with 23, while Utica improves to 23-6.

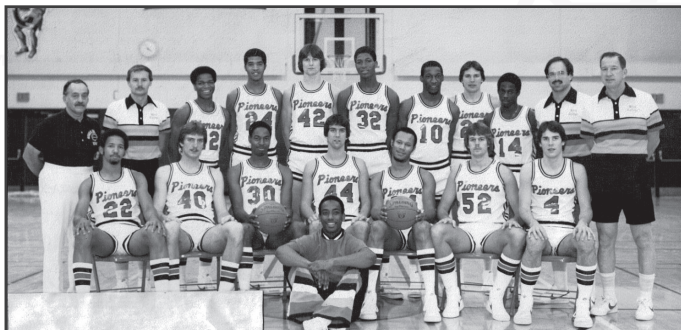

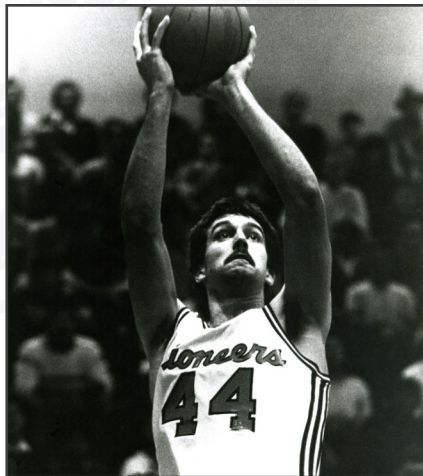

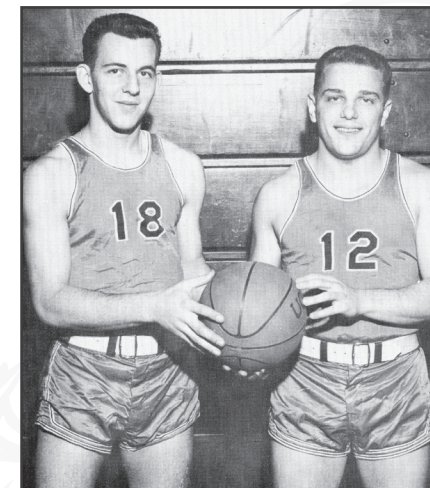

GARY M. KUNATH FITNESS CENTER

UC's newly renovated 6,400 square foot fitness facility is located in the Harold T. Clark Athletic Center and is open to students, faculty, and staff.

Exercise Equipment

The Gary M. Kunath Fitness Center offers entirely new equipment, including:

CLARK ATHLETIC CENTER GYMNASIUM

The gymnasium, with a 2,200 seating capacity, features three full-length basketball courts and six suspended hoops. It is the home to the Utica College basketball program as well as the UC women's volleyball team. Practices for several UC athletic programs are also held in the gymnasium (as well as a variety of intramural activities). Several community events are also housed inside the gymnasium including America's Greatest Heat Run and Walk.

UTICA COLLEGE POOL OF CHAMPIONS

The Utica College pool is an 8-lane, 25-yard by 6-lane, 25-meter pool fully equipped with a 1-meter diving facility. It is the home of the Utica College men's and women's swim and diving programs as well as the women's water polo team. The balcony area offers seating for 185 spectators, and it also boasts a golf net practice facility.

The pool is open to all students, faculty, and staff and memberships for community patrons are available. A certified lifeguard must be on staff to use the pool.

HAROLD T. CLARK SR. TEAM FACILITY

The Harold T. Clark Jr. team facility is located on the east end of the Clark Athletic Center. The facility features a state-of-the-art, fully equipped physical training center with hot and cold tubs, multiple training tables, and top-of-the-line rehab equipment. The team facility also boasts additional locker rooms, showers, laundry room, and an all-purpose classroom for meetings.

PIONEER ATHLETIC HALL OF FAME

The Hall of Fame was established in 2008 to celebrate the dedicated student-athletes, coaches, administrators, and benefactors whose extraordinary achievements express the values of Utica College in the spirit of competition within a lifelong learning environment.

The Hall of Fame is located in the main lobby of the Harold T. Clark Athletic Center as you enter the handicap-accessible entrance to the gymnasium.

UTICA MEMORIAL AUDITORIUM



The Utica College men's and women's hockey teams play home games at the Utica Memorial Auditorium.

Located in downtown Utica, just five miles from campus, the "Aud" is a state-of-the-art hockey facility with a seating capacity for more than 4,000 fans. The college built its own annex containing locker rooms, storage, and a training room.

US College Hockey On-line calls the Utica Auditorium one of the top rinks in Division III.

OUTDOOR FACILITIES

CHARLES A. GAETANO STADIUM

Utica College's multi-purpose stadium has significantly changed the campus landscape since construction began in the fall of 2001. Home to the Pioneers' varsity field hockey, football, and men and women's lacrosse teams, the facility also hosts occasional intercollegiate soccer games and a number of intramural and recreational activities throughout the year.

Located on the campus's northern edge behind the Clark Athletic Center, the stadium features grandstand seating for 1,200, an elegant brick façade and gateway entrance, modern press facilities, a courtyard adjoining the stadium with the College's soccer field and baseball diamond, and a state-of-the-art synthetic turf playing field.

The stadium also features a synthetic Field Turf playing surface identical to that used by many professional and Division I sports teams.

The stadium bears the name of Charles A. Gaetano, a prominent local business leader and emeritus director of the Utica College Foundation. A formal dedication of the stadium was held in the fall of 2002.



UTICA COLLEGE BASEBALL FIELD

The home of the Utica College baseball team is located adjacent to Charles A. Gaetano Stadium in the northeast end of campus. The fence-enclosed facility features new dug outs, bullpen pitching mounds, and an outdoor batting practice cage.

UTICA COLLEGE SOCCER FIELD

The Utica College soccer field is located on the northeast end of campus next to Charles A. Gaetano Stadium and the Utica College Baseball Field. The all-grass surface is home to the UC men's and women's soccer programs and features European style goals. The soccer facilities are available to students, faculty, and staff, weather permitting, throughout the entire year, and are also used for specific intramural activities.

UTICA COLLEGE TENNIS COURTS

The UC tennis courts are located on the north end of campus adjacent to Charles A. Gaetano Stadium. The hard court surface, which is home of the College's men's and women's tennis programs, is fully enclosed with four regulation-size courts. The tennis facilities are available to students, faculty and staff, weather permitting, throughout the entire year.

GREENMAN FIELD

Greenman Field, home to the Utica College softball team, is located directly across Burrstone Road, adjacent to White Hall. The fully enclosed field, which is operated by the City of Utica, features dugouts and a sandstone infield ideal for northeast weather conditions.



UTICA COLLEGE IN BRIEF

Utica College is a comprehensive private college that offers the wide range of academic programs, excellent faculty, and diversity of a large university while at the same time providing the intimate learning environment and individual attention of a small college. A combination of liberal arts and professional studies gives students opportunities to gain broad-based exposure to major areas of knowledge while simultaneously developing career-specific skills designed to ensure success in the workforce.

MISSION

Utica College educates students for rewarding careers, responsible citizenship, and fulfilling lives by integrating liberal and professional study, by creating a community of learners with diverse experiences and perspectives, by balancing its local heritage with a global perspective, by encouraging lifelong learning, and by promoting scholarship in the belief that the discovery and application of knowledge enrich teaching and learning.

CAMPUS

Utica College's current campus, located in a predominantly residential section of west Utica, was established in 1961. Situated on 128 acres, the campus features large grassy lawns, open fields, walkways lined with trees and flowerbeds, and outdoor pieces of sculpture. The campus is comprised of 22 buildings, including a new academic building with several smart classrooms, modern residence halls, and modern athletic and fitness facilities. In the summer of 2007, Utica College opened F. Eugene Romano Hall, the first phase of a state-of-the-art science and technology complex. In addition, the new Economic Crime and Justice Studies building was dedicated in 2008.

ENROLLMENT

Approximately 3,000 undergraduate and graduate students attend Utica College. The student population represents a large diversity of cultural, religious, and socio-economic backgrounds and offers a wide variety of perspectives and experiences. While one third of the student body is local to central New York, a majority of students come from throughout New York, New England, and the Middle Atlantic States. Still others come from other parts of the United States and from other countries.



ACADEMIC PROGRAMS

Utica College offers degrees in 37 undergraduate majors and 20 graduate programs, including two professional doctoral programs, as well as a number of pre-professional and special programs. The College also offers continuing education programs, undergraduate programs with flexible scheduling for busy working adults, and professional development certificate programs.

ALUMNI

Utica College has nearly 20,000 members nationwide and worldwide.

ACADEMIC STRUCTURE

Utica College's academic structure is comprised of the School of Arts and Sciences, the School of Business and Justice Studies, the School of Health Professions and Education, and the School of Graduate and Extended Studies.

FACULTY

Utica College is a student-centered teaching college, and although faculty are recognized as experts in their field they are known best for the close, personal attention they give to their students. Of the 123 full-time faculty; 106 of those have terminal degrees. The student-to-faculty ratio is 17:1. The average class size is 22 students.

CAMPUS LIFE

Utica College offers an impressive array of opportunities for students to participate in governance, cocurricular activities, and community service. The College is home to a wide range of academic, cultural, social, political, religious, service, and media-related student organizations. UC offers 25 Division III Intercollegiate sports and a number of club sports. The College also hosts a vibrant calendar of cultural events, including art exhibits, literary readings, musical and theatre performances, and guest lecture series.
