

HEAD COACH DAVE CLAUSEN

Dave Clausen enters his seventh season as head coach at UC after leading the Pioneers to an ECAC West playoff berth in each of his first six seasons.

Clausen led the team to a progam best 18-5-3 record in 2006-07. The Pioneers entered the ECAC West Conference Tournament ranked No. 7 in the nation but fell to Elmira 1-0. He has coached a school-best three All-Americans: Jill Nolan (2005-06), Deana Wiegand (2006-07), and Stephanie Price (2006-07).

In 2005-06, Clausen led the Pioneers to an appearance in the ECAC championship game. The Pioneers ended the season ranked No. 9 nationally by USCHO.com, marking the first time ever the team finished the year ranked in the top 10 nationally.



Clausen came to Utica from Brunswick, ME, where he was the assistant coach with the Bowdoin College Polar Bears. As assistant coach, Clausen helped lead that program to its fifth consecutive postseason appearance and a top 10 national ranking. He was also an assistant coach at Hamilton College and Maine Maritime Academy.

During the three years as an assistant coach at Hamilton, he played a major role in the team's transition from a small club to a nationally competitive varsity program. Additionally, he has spent the off-season as a director and coach at various women's and girls' summer hockey camps and clinics in the Northeast, including the Inside-Edge Clinic, The Bowdoin Hockey Clinic, the Hamilton Hockey School, and the New York State Amateur Hockey Association's Girls' Festival at SUNY Morrisville. Clausen is also a member of the Division III Women's Ice Hockey NCAA Championship Committee.

Clausen, along with head men's ice hockey coach Gary Heenan, was appointed head coach of the Utica College golf program in 2004.

Clausen earned a bachelor of arts degree in English in May 1998 at Hamilton College, and resides in Clinton with his wife, Amy, son Noah, and daughter Casey.

The Utica College women's hockey team has a tall order ahead of them as it enters the 2007-2008 season looking to replace 11 graduated seniors, including consensus All-Americans Deana Wiegand and Stephanie Price.

"Wiegand and Price will go down in history as two of the best players to come through Utica College, and we will miss their presence both on and off the ice," says head coach Dave Clausen, who has compiled an 89-56-11 record in six seasons at UC. "Even though we will miss the graduated seniors I am excited about the young talent we have and the core of veterans still here."



Those veterans include junior captain Jessica Leclerc, classmate and assistant captain Samantha Rowan, and senior assistant captain Laura Schnitker. Leclerc, a defender, earned second team all-conference honors after posting 17 points on four goals and 13 assists last season. She helped guide the Pioneers to the No. 1 ranked combined special teams in the country (62.4%). UC scored on 39 of its 151 power play opportunities, good for second in the country, while stopping 182 of their opponents 203 power-play chances.

Rowan, a forward, played in all 26 games last season, totaling 22 points on 12 goals and 10 assists. Her 12 goals were good for fifth on the team. In two seasons at UC she has played in 50 games, scoring 15 goals and adding 14 assists.

Schnitker has played defense for the Pioneers for the past two seasons, totaling 12 assists and three goals in 50 career games. Last season she scored 10 points on eight assists and two goals. She was also named to the 2007 ECAC Women's West All-Academic Team.

The Pioneers finished last season ranked No. 10 nationally by U.S. College Hockey Online after posting an 18-5-3 overall record and a 10-2-2 record in the ECAC West Conference. They earned the No. 3 seed in the conference tournament but fell 1-0 to No. 2 Elmira College in the first round. The Pioneers have made the ECAC West Conference Tournament in all six seasons of their existence. UC netted 121 goals total last season, good for second best in school-history behind the 2003-2004 squad that netted 134 goals.

"We may not have the top scoring firstline in the nation this season, but I really do think we may have a little more talent

from top to bottom," Clausen says. "I feel comfortable that we will have three strong lines this season and that should make us more consistent overall."

Sophomore **Andrea Maxon** is the top returning scorer from last season. Maxon played in all 26 games and ranked fourth on the team with 24 points (13 goals, 11 assists). She ranked second on the team with 11 goals in conference play and earned

ECAC Women's West Conference All-Rookie Team status. Maxon also earned Rookie of the Week honors once last season after tallying two goals in the Pioneers' 11-0 win over visiting Cortland State on November 21, 2006.

Junior forward **Krystal Cummings** will also be called upon to produce on the offensive end for the Pioneers after tallying 20 points last season on seven goals and 13 assists. Up front with Cummings will be senior



Kelly Bills and sophomore Kristina Reeves. Bills looks to add to her 30 career points, while Reeves hopes to find the back of the net more consistently after playing in all 26 games as a freshman. Clausen says, "Some of our best athletes are on the defensive end." Defenders' Leclerc, Ashley Kaufman, Amanda McDonnell and sophomore goalie Jill Doherty are all multi-sport athletes at Utica College, which helps to keep them in playing shape year round.

Kaufman, a former all-conference selection, has 25 career points on 10 goals and 15 assists in 66 games, while McDonnell has totaled 11 points in 49 games. Doherty replaces graduated goalie **Stephanie Yates**. She started three games last season and posted a 4-0 record including one shut out. She allowed just three goals against in four games played.



"We have returning talent on both ends of the ice, and we brought in 16 freshmen this year," says Clausen. "If I can get the veterans to play like they are capable and the younger players to continue to mature hopefully we can make our seventh straight appearance in the conference tournament."

Jack Kane began his coaching career at Utica College in 2004 after an extensive coaching and playing career in Clinton, NY.

He previously coached at Clinton High School, and was a journey-man player throughout professional hockey leagues across the United States. After being invited to the National Hockey League's Detroit Red Wings' preseason camp in the early 1950s he joined the Barry Flyers in 1954. He played with the Flyers until 1957, followed by a one-year stint with the Chatham Maroons. He won the Allen Cup with the Whitby Dulops in the late 50s, before joining the Clinton Comets in 1960.



Kane played for the Comets of the East Coast Hockey League for 13 seasons, and he led the league in scoring on three occasions. The Toronto, Ontario native won four Walker Cups with the Comets.

Kane, resides in Clinton with his wife Elaine.
